FROM THE PRESIDENT

At the last Mother's Club meeting each year, I congratulate the members who had children just graduate. In addition to the usual congratulatory statements, this year I was able to offer a special compliment to the group because of a certain outstanding accomplishment of the class of 2006.

For many reasons, such as extraordinary effort, quality instruction, academic talent, home support and the ACT Prep Program, this year's graduates earned an amazing \$3.6 million in college scholarships. This figure is substantially above the more typical figure of \$2-\$2.5 million and averages out to more than \$16,000 in scholarship monies per graduate.

As I told the mothers that evening, that is like getting a rebate on three years of Miege tuition upon graduation.

While obviously every student did not receive that specific amount of help with college costs, the large figure does remain an incredible feat. It also further substantiates the benefits of investing in a Miege education. Not only do our students receive spiritual direction and a greater understanding of their faith, they also are recipients of quality education that prepares them for the challenges of college.

In addition, there is more good news. It comes from the recurring lesson of respect that has been taught both at school and at home. Because respect has been stressed so much in both settings, we should all feel good that our seniors handled their many graduation activities in a very appropriate and respectful way. Their conduct serves as a positive example of the good in today's young people.

All of the parents of our graduates should be very proud of their children. We at Miege share that pride with them. On behalf of our entire staff, we would like to thank the graduating seniors and their parents for allowing us to be a part of these very important four years. We will miss the class of 2006 and wish them all of God's blessings.

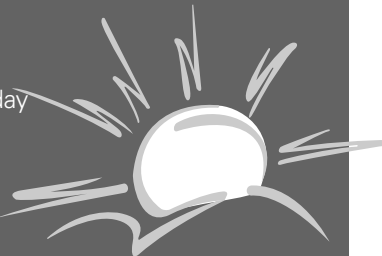

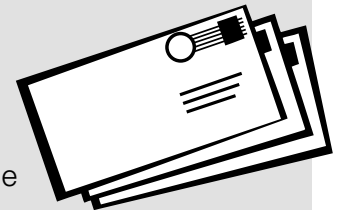

REGIONAL MUSIC FESTIVAL

On April 8 eight students received I ratings (outstanding) for vocal solos at

STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS

GET INVOLVED AT MIEGE

FORENSICS AND DEBATE (ELECTIVE)

These are classes that students enroll in for credit. Teams compete against other forensics/debate teams in the state. Enrollment is limited.

MUSIC — VOCAL (ELECTIVE)

Classes for credit are offered to freshman through senior students at various levels. Competition and concerts are part of the class. Students sign up for the classes. Some require a tryout, some are open to anyone.

CHEERLEADING

Tryouts are held yearly. The squad practices and camp is during the summer. Freshmen through seniors may try out with a limited number making the team. They perform during the fall and winter sports seasons.

DRILL TEAM

Try-outs are held yearly. The squad practices summers and attend camp. Sophomores through seniors may try out with a limited number making the team. The team performs during the fall and winter seasons.

CATEGORIES (QUIZ BOWL TEAM)

A select group of students, sophomores through seniors, interested and well-informed in various academic areas, compete with teams from other schools. If interested, see moderator.

CAMPUS MINISTRY

Sign up at the Campus Ministry Office. The work of the campus Ministry Team deals with helping the school community build a Catholic, Christian environment. The team attends workshops and retreats. This is a year-round organization for freshmen through seniors.

PEER HELPERS

These students are chosen by the students at large. These students help others with problems in the school. They are trained at workshops and offer help to the entire school.

DRUG/ALCOHOL TEAM

These are students chosen by the faculty to represent and promote a drug-free school. These students are instructed at a workshop during the school year and promote school life without drugs and alcohol.

ATHLETICS

Students need to try out and attend preseason meetings. Contact Miego if you are interested in a sport and need information on whom to contact. Athletes compete, practice and play an important part in building a strong community at Miego. Students receive awards for participation.

ATHLETIC TEAM MANAGERS OR STUDENT ATHLETIC TRAINERS

Any student interested in being a team manager needs only to contact the coach of the sport that interests them. Managers help with all duties related to the team and in some cases keep statistics at contests. The managers can letter and be recognized for outstanding service. Student trainers need to report to the athletic trainer in charge of the training room. In some cases, these trainers will be involved in seminars or inhouse training conducted by the Pro Rehab trainer.

MODERATORS: Coaches and Pro Rehab Trainer

CLUBS (FRENCH, GERMAN, SPANISH, SCIENCE, ETC.)

All clubs are organized in their respective classrooms. Open to all students. Projects and fund raising are a part of the cultural

and educational make-up of the clubs. Sign up in your classrooms.

MODERATORS: Teachers

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Selected students are voted into this academic organization. Requirements are: scholarship, leadership, character and service. The Honor Society offers tutoring and special functions for students throughout the year.

FACETS

Facets is the school's fine arts magazine. Art work and writing may be submitted by any student before Christmas for publication in May. The staff are volunteers and must attend after-school workshops and meetings to prepare for publication.

Classes for credit are offered to students at various levels. Stage productions are part of class. Open to freshmen through seniors. You sign up for the classes.

Class is for credit and students must have completed the prerequisite Journalism I class. Students work on every facet of the yearbook including reporting, writing, editing and designing on a Macintosh computer.

FIRST-TIMERS' FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. WHAT IS THE MIEGE WEB SITE ADDRESS?

www.bishopmiege.com (a great source for school info!)

2. WHAT IS ACTIVITY PERIOD?

A period of time set aside during the week for clubs and student organizations. If you are not in a meeting, you are to attend an assigned study hall.

3. WHERE DO I GO TO DROP/ADD A CLASS?

Guidance Office.

4. WHERE DO I GO IF I LOST MY SCHEDULE AND NEED A NEW COPY?

Guidance Office.

5. CAN I BRING MY OWN LUNCH?

Yes, but there is no refrigerator available.

6. WHERE DO I GO IF I FEEL SICK DURING THE DAY?

You ask your teacher, who will send you to the nurse.

7. WHERE DO I GO IF I HAVE A LOCKER PROBLEM?

Administrative Office.

8. WHO DO I SEE IF I HAVE A PROBLEM IN A CLASS?

Your classroom teacher first, then make an appointment with the Guidance Office.

9. WHERE DO I GO IF I GET A DETENTION?

Attendance Office to schedule the detention.

10. WHAT HAPPENS IF I AM LATE FOR CLASS?

First hour: go to the Attendance Office for a pass. Second through seventh hours: go to your class and receive a tardy. After three excused tardies, you will receive detentions.

11. WHAT DO I DO IF I AM LATE FOR PERIOD ONE?

Go to the Attendance Office and get a blue pass.

12. WHAT DO I NEED TO DO IF I MISS A DAY OF SCHOOL BECAUSE I WAS SICK?

Have your parents/guardians call the school to excuse you.

13. WHAT DO I WEAR FOR GYM?

The gym instructor will explain P.E. attire to you.

14. HOW DO I CONTACT A TEACHER IF I WANT TO TALK WITH HIM/HER?

See them after class or between classes to set up an appointment.

15. WHO DO I SEE/WHERE DO I GO IF I WANT TO JOIN A SPORT?

Meetings will be announced for those interested in trying out. The *Trumpeter* and various mailings will keep you informed.

16. WHO DO I SEE/WHERE DO I GO IF I WANT TO JOIN AN ACTIVITY?

Stop in the Attendance Office to find out who the moderators are and when they are available.

17. WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO BE ON THE HONOR ROLL?

3.0 GPA or above for second honors, 3.5 GPA or above for first honors.

18. HOW DO I USE MY ID? WHAT IF I LOSE MY ID?

Your ID allows you into some Miege events free. If it is lost, go to the Attendance Office with another photo. You will be charged a \$5 fee.

19. CAN I BUY SCHOOL SUPPLIES AT SCHOOL?

Some supplies are sold in the Stag Shop.

20. WHAT IS THE STAG SHOP AND WHAT IS SOLD THERE? WHAT ARE THE HOURS?

The Stag Shop is a school store that sells dress code apparel, school supplies and

other Miege clothing. The hours are fourth hour lunch and after school on Wednesdays and Fridays. The phone extension is 242.

21. WHERE DO I GO IF I WANT TO USE A COPY MACHINE?

There is a copy machine in the Media Center; the cost is 10¢ per copy.

22. WHERE DO I GO TO USE THE PHONE?

School office phones are for official school business or emergency use only. Calls to parents, not directed by the school, are to be made on the pay phones. Pay phones are available in the Commons foyer. Students are to make calls before or after school, during activity time or at lunch.

23. WHERE CAN I GET CHANGE FOR THE PHONE OR COPY MACHINE?

The Administrative Office.

24. HOW DO I CHECK ON GRADES?

www.edline.com — information will be sent to you.

25. WHAT HAPPENS IF I COME TO SCHOOL OUT OF UNIFORM?

You will remain in the Attendance Office until correct clothing can be brought to the school. A minor dress code infraction is a detention for each class hour the student is out of dress code, up to three 50-minute detentions for one day.

26. WHAT IS A MIXER?

A dance that only Miege students can attend (held at the school).

27. CAN FRESHMEN GO TO DANCES?

Only to mixers. They may not attend Homecoming, Sadie Hawkins or Prom.

28. CAN I GET TO MY LOCKER AFTER SCHOOL HOURS?

Yes, until the doors are locked at 4 p.m.

FRESHMAN FAQ

29. HOW DO MY PARENTS GET INVOLVED WITH SCHOOL?

They can join one or several different organizations that offer memberships. They may also volunteer their help to organizations.

30. WHAT IS THE STAG STRUT?

A student fund-raiser in which students collect pledges for a five-mile walk. This fund-raiser helps defray the cost of tuition.

31. WHERE DO I FIND OUT ABOUT BUSES?

The Administrative Office. The bus is available to Kansas students only and costs \$90 per semester. School Services determines the drop off and pick up points based on ridership – usually these are within a few blocks of home.

32. WHAT DOES THE AVERAGE LUNCH COST?

\$4 to \$5. The menu consists of cheeseburgers, hamburgers, fries, grilled cheese and other specialty items. Fruit, salads and snacks are also available.

33. DOES MIEGE HAVE A SCHOOL SUPPLY LIST?

No. Teachers will inform you of necessary supplies.

34. WHERE DO I FIND OUT ABOUT STUDENT PARKING?

Attendance Office. See handbook for rules. A parking pass costs \$25. Freshmen may not drive to school.

35. HOW DO PARENTS DROP OFF AND PICK UP THEIR STUDENTS?

Parents may drop their student off either at the west doors or south doors.

36. HOW DO WE FIND OUT ABOUT SNOW DAYS?

Listen to the radio or television. They will announce that the Johnson County Catholic Schools will not be in session.

37. WHAT ARE LATE STARTS?

School starts at 8:15 instead of 7:50 a.m., usually because of staff meetings that are on the school calendar. Unscheduled late starts may be called because of bad road conditions. This announcement will be carried by the local media.

FIRST DAY Q&A

WHERE DO I GO FOR FRESHMEN ORIENTATION?

You report to your homeroom at noon on Thursday, August 17, 2006. Your homeroom number is listed on your class schedule which you will receive the first week in August.

DO I NEED ANY SCHOOL SUPPLIES THE FIRST DAY?

Bring a pen or pencil and a sheet of paper for notes. Your teachers will give you specific information once regular classes begin.

WHAT SHOULD I WEAR FOR ORIENTATION DAY?

Wear the regular school uniform.

WHEN ARE SCHOOL PICTURES TAKEN AND HOW MUCH ARE THEY?

Pictures are taken during orientation. Identification pictures are required for all students. Several picture packet options are available for a variety of prices. Bring a check for the purchase.

HOW DO I FIND MY LOCKER AND OPEN IT?

Your locker number and combination are printed on your class schedule. To open your locker, first spin the dial a couple times to the right to clear it, and then continue to the right and

stop on the first number. Secondly, turn the dial to the left and go past the second number once and stop on the second number the second time. Thirdly, turn the dial back to the right and stop on the third number, lift the handle and successfully open your locker on the first try!

WHAT DO I DO IF I CANNOT OPEN MY LOCKER?

Try the above procedure at least three times. If the locker will still not open, come to the Administrative Office (located at the west entrance to the building) for help.

ARE BACKPACKS ALLOWED IN THE CLASSROOMS?

No.

ARE CELL PHONES, PAGERS, OR MUSIC PLAYERS ALLOWED AT SCHOOL?

No.

WHERE SHOULD PARENTS PICK UP THEIR FRESHMEN?

They may be picked up at the south or west entrances immediately after school. On a regular school day, students may wait at the south entrance until 5 p.m. They must be picked up by that time.

38. HOW DO I SIGN UP FOR PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES?

Parents are mailed a form to return with their conference time choices.

39. HOW DO I ARRANGE FOR AN EARLY DISMISSAL/LATE ARRIVAL FOR A DOCTOR'S APPOINTMENT?

Parents must call the Attendance Office in advance for the appointment: 913-262-2700.

40. WHO DO I SEE IF I WANT TO TALK WITH SOMEONE ABOUT A PERSONAL MATTER?

First, go the Guidance Office or the Campus Ministry Office. If not possible, see any teacher, administrator or staff member who can advise you.

41. WHERE DO I SIGN UP FOR SERVICE HOURS?

Sign up in the Campus Ministry Office, which is located by the west entrance.

BISHOP MIEGE SUMMER READING

All students are required to read the selections listed for their grades and levels of English. Testing over summer reading will take place the first week of school.

Students will not be responsible for taking notes along with their reading. **However, highlighting and annotating in your own book is highly encouraged.**

NOTE: Junior level AP students will be required to write a paper based on their summer reading within the first quarter of school. They might find it helpful to take chapter notes marking specific quotes and literary devices to be used in their paper. A notebook of summaries might help the student to recall where specific passages were mentioned, without having to review the entire text(s), when writing the paper.

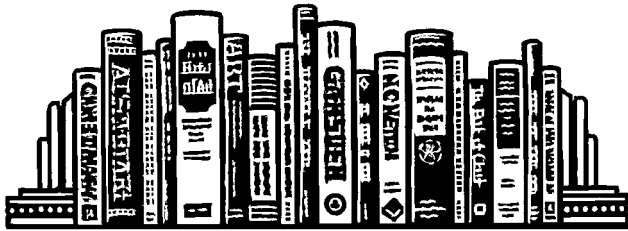

BOYS' BASKETBALL

The 2005-2006 boys' basketball team kept the tradition alive with the program's eighth consecutive appearance at the 5A State Tournament, which is currently the state's longest streak. Even though the team suffered a disappointing first-round loss to state runner-up Highland Park, there were many reasons to celebrate. The boys compiled a 17-8 overall record and were Regional champions. The Stags also made history when senior Isaac Miles became the school's first Direnna Award winner. This award is given to Kansas City's best all-around basketball player, as voted by the media and area coaches. Isaac was also honored for the second year by The Kansas City Star as a first team All Metro and All State performer. Junior Chris Combs also captured postseason honors with first team All EKL and second team All Johnson County. Chris shattered the school's record for most three-point shots with 64. Senior James Lampone also received honorable mention for the EKL league.

The 2005-2006 team will be remembered for being great competitors with great senior leaders. These young men made a great impact on the Miege basketball family and the whole Miege community.

GIRLS' SOCCER

The girls' soccer program had a very successful 2006 season. A record number of girls came out to play this spring. Anna DiLeonardo, new to the program, coached our C-Team, and Joe Schramp returned to coach the Junior Varsity squad. Players from both teams developed individually and collectively over the course of the season.

After playing a tough schedule, the Varsity team went to the State Tournament with a 7-9 record. The team won its region with victories against St. James Academy (W, 1-0), Mill Valley (W, 3-2) and Kansas City Christian (W, 2-1).

The Regional semi-final game against Mill Valley was decided after a shootout. The game went through 80 minutes of regulation, two 10-minute sudden death periods and two five-minute sudden

death periods. In the postseason, if a game is still tied, the teams go to a best-of-five penalty kick shootout. After the first five shooters, the teams were tied 2-2 in penalty kicks. The kicks then advance to head-to-head shooting. The game was decided on the 10th shooter, with Miege coming out on top.

The team advanced to the State Quarterfinal game against St. Thomas Aquinas. It was a very well-played game, which Aquinas won 3-0.

SWIM AND DIVE

The 2005-2006 Swim and Dive season was one of growth and development. Each squad for boys and girls doubled in size, and the team was 3-1 in Dual and Tri meets. The boys sent the 200 Free Relay to the State Tournament, where the squad of Alex Bryant, Tim Pintar, Sean Sumrall and Steve Sparks just missed breaking the school record by half a second. Still, they swam three seconds faster than their qualifying time. Lee Gibbs, who received the MVP award this season, also made it to State in the 100 Breaststroke.

The girls' team more than doubled to 39 members. The squad is extremely young, and we have a few more year-round swimmers coming in for the 2007 season. The team broke the 200 Free Relay record this year, and Jaelyn Unruh broke her own 100 Breastroke record. Jaelyn and Stephanie Foster made the All-EKL League team. Stephanie improved one place at State, finishing seventh in Diving. The team finished in 11th place in Springfield out of 25. Tessa Bonney and Roxanne Russell joined Jaelyn and Stephanie at State on the Relay squad. The team made State in the 200 Medley Relay as well as consideration times for State in 200 Free and 400 Free Relay. Jaelyn made State in the 200 IM as well as consideration times in 100 Fly, 100 Free and 50 Free. The girls are entering their junior and senior years in 2006-2007, so they should return to State next year. The team will be stronger with their increased effort to make Miege a swim school.

BOYS' GOLF

Bishop Miege hosted the Regional 5A Boys Golf Tournament this year at Sycamore Ridge G.C. The team just missed the cut to be a state contender by two strokes. However, Senior Bryan Rollo finished eighth and made it as an individual qualifier. At the State Tournament in Salina, Kan., Bryan shot a personal best 76 to finish in the top 25.

SOFTBALL

The Miege Varsity Softball Team ended its 2006 campaign with a hard-fought 4-3 loss in Regionals. The squad finished the season with a 13-8 record.

The team says goodbye to four seniors: Rachel Baxter (who will play softball at Benedictine), Amy Byfield (who will play volleyball at Emporia State), Becca Smith-Vandergriff (who will play softball at Benedictine) and Alex Zimmerman (who will play softball at Johnson County Community College).
